3P rovide rubrics, examples, and checklist for targeted improvement his ill help students monitor their ow wrks and clearly understand expectations. Gingstudents the rubrics ill also help the instructorgade more efficiently. This also help engg students in learning rocess, improve student motivation, and develop competence in setfaluation.

4P rovide timely,

actionable, focused and specificeedback on student wrk and offer opportunities to use feedback for revision. Wingstudents constructive feedback immediatelyon howhey did or hat can be done allow them to track their progess and improve their wrk. I is important to give timely feedback because students can forgt hat they did on their wrks and cant use the feedback effectively. Poviding students a chance to revise their wrks help them gin a deeper understanding of their progess, reinforce geat wrk in the future, and also encourage them to learn from their mistakes.
