Nick Tsarevsky obtained M.S. degree in physical chemistry and chemical physics in 1999 from the University of Sofia, Bulgaria, and Ph.D. degree in chemistry in 2005 from Carnegie Mellon University under the supervision of Prof. Kris Matyjaszewski. He was visiting assistant professor at the Department of Chemistry at Carnegie Mellon University (2005-6), and a member of the founding team of ATRP Solutions, Inc. (2007-2010). He joined the Department of Chemistry at Southern Methodist University in 2010, and in 2016 he was promoted to associate professor. In 2020-21, he served as program director at the National Science Foundation. Since 2012 has been also an Affiliate Faculty in Graduate Liberal Studies at the Department of Lifelong Learning in the Annette Caldwell Simmons School of Education and Human Development. Nick has authored and coauthored over 100 peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters, textbook, and has served as the coeditor of 7 books.
