SPRING 2021 GRADUATION PROFILE TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY-KINGSVILLE

The SPRING graduating class of 2021 at Texas A&M University-Kingsville consisted of 902 graduates. Three of them received two bachelor's degrees each. This makes a total of 905 degrees for SPRING 2021. Out of 905 degrees granted, there were 662 bachelor's degrees, 238 master's degrees, and 5 doctoral degrees.

Of the 902 graduates, 756 (84%) were from Texas, 10 (1%) were from other states or United States Armed Forces when they entered the university, including Alabama (2), Armed Forces (1), California (1), Colorado (1), Idaho (1), Missouri (1), New Jersey (1), New Mexico (1) and Ohio (1). 136 (15%) were from other countries or regions, including India (103), Kuwait (10), Nigeria (10), Mexico (3), Saudi Arabia (2), Vietnam (2), Bolivia (1), Brazil (1), Ghana (1), Honduras (1), Iran (1) and Nepal (1).

The most frequent county of origin of in-state graduates was Hidalgo (167), followed by Cameron (116), Nueces (107), Kleberg (53) and Jim Wells (37).

Of the graduating class, 612 (68%) were minority students. 522 (79%) of the bachelor's, 88 (37%) of the master's, and 2 (40%) of the doctoral graduates were minority students.

Of the graduating class, 507 (56%) were female. 382 (58%) of the bachelor's, 122 (51%) of the master's, and 3 (60%) of the doctoral graduates were female.

Of the 659 undergraduates, 336 (51%) entered the university as first-time undergraduates and 323 (49%) entered as transfer students. Of the 336 first-time undergraduates, 65 (19%) took at least one developmental course. Of the 323 transfer students, 6 (2%) took at least one developmental course.

Of the 902 graduates, one was full-time university who received a master's degree.
