II. Presentations

a) Interim PresidentJames Hallmark

Board of Regents Meeting

Interim President Hallmark commented that the Board of Regents meeting two weeks ago the prime topic was how to reduce student debt. He said that discussion is leading to charges from the regents t find plans for helping students. He mentioned that several of the student body presidents were surprised at hownuch the Board of Regents cares about people who don't qualify for Pell grants.

Another topic at that meeting was the use of standardized test scores in admissions policies. President Hallmark said that the way TAMUK uses ACT/SAT scores in admissions policies problematic to him. The Board of Regents feels that they patentially biased.
